Life Saving Equipment at Ysgol Aberconwy!

A cardiac arrest can happen at any time, anywhere. Did you know... seven out of 10 people who suffer a cardiac arrest could survive, if they are treated with a defibrillator within the first five minutes!

Here at Ysgol Aberconwy we are pleased to announce through fundraising efforts, a donation from Conwy Leisure Services and match funding from the Sam Standerwick Memorial Fund, we've purchased not one, but TWO defibrillators.



Adrian, Sam's dad and founder of the memorial fund said, "I'm delighted to be able to present Ysgol Aberconwy with two lifesaving machines. It's hugely important to make sure everyone is aware of Cardiac Risk in the Young, which is something I'll continue working towards. But to also be able to help towards the funding of these machines is a great achievement for the memorial fund. We hope they are never needed but it is good to know there are two in a school, which has nearly 800 young people, so if there is a need they can be used without delay, potentially saving a young persons life."

One defibrillator will be based at the school reception and the other one will be based in the school sports hall, which is also used outside of school hours by the general public.

E-Safety Advice for Parents & Guardians...

Facebook...

Did you know anyone who holds a Facebook account should be at least 13 years old?

If you or your child have a Facebook account are you aware, who can see your posts and if you can be found using a public web search?

Ensure you can't be found in a public web search!

- Go to Facebook settings...
- If you use a computer, you will need to click the drop down arrow you will find top right of the page and click 'Settings'.
- If you use your phone you need to press the three small lines bottom right corner and select 'Settings'.
- Once inside the 'Settings' area select 'Privacy'
- Here you can change the options on your Facebook activity and how people can find you.
- If you don't want to appear in searches outside of Facebook, click edit and remove the tick from this box or from your phone ensure this option is disabled.



Who sees your posts?

Before you post an update on your page, you can choose who sees it by selecting the privacy option. You can choose from the following main options:

- **Public** – anyone on or off Facebook can see it.
- **Friends** – Only your Friends on Facebook can see it.
- **Friends except... / Specific Friends...** - You can target a post so only the people you want seeing a post.
- **Only me** – no one else will see the post apart from you.

Make sure you know who can see your posts!
