- Knowing some basic grammar terms such as noun, adjective, verb and adverb
- Knowing what 'language' and 'culture' mean
- Finding out about some important writers such as Shakespeare and Chaucer

# How Will I be assessed?

## In this project, you will learn...

- How writing began through cave drawings, Egyptian hieroglyphics and Viking runes.
- How storytelling began as a way of passing time. You will listen to well-told stories and plan a re-telling of their favourite story.
- How ancient languages such as Latin and Greek have influenced the English language
- What is Old English and how English was influenced by the Norman Invaders from France.
- About changes in English by comparing versions of The Lord's Prayer
- About a Shakespeare play and how Shakespeare created mood and atmosphere and engaged his audience
- What are accents and dialects. You will listen to and identify different accents, discuss our own dialect and how Welsh words are part of the way we speak.
- What is culture? How do we express our culture?
- How to reflect on the unit as a whole and write a language autobiography exploring how our own use of language has developed and what has helped shape your identity
- How English has been influenced by technological advancements and the media.
- About language changes with particular reference to how language has changed when referring to race or sexuality.

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
