Y Sgert / The Skirt




- The skirt <u>must</u> be a pleated skirt

A phrase they will hear a lot this week:

'How we do it here'

They will be very used to 'how things are done' at their primary school. It will take a little time but they will soon get familiar with how things are done here at Ysgol Aberconwy.

Our routines, organisation, expectation, responses are all very different and what we expect of them is very different.

Phone free space

- ✓ Our school is a phone free space
- ✓ We do not take their phone off them but it is locked away in their pouch each day.
- ✓ This is so that they can be present with their friends and engaged in the learning and experiences in front of them.
- ✓ Each day they must turn their phone on silent and lock into their pouch BEFORE they arrive at school. Their tutors will check these each morning.
- ✓ Their phone can be unlocked at the end of the day.





Lessons – What to expect

- ✓ They will see a teacher for a maximum of 3 hours per week.
- ✓ It will take a long time for us to know they as well as their primary teacher.
- ✓ We try to have the same routines to make it easier but some staff do things
 a certain way they should try to pick up on this.
- ✓ Different lessons require different things from them and have different learning environments.
- √ The key is to RESPOND to the teachers lead!

Expectations

- ✓ If They turn up, show up and give each day all they have got, they will do very well here, They will enjoy school and get the most out of all the experiences we have to offer.
- ✓ We ask that they are Ready (for learning) Respectful (of everyone) and Kind (to all) each and every day
- ✓ The great thing is that they CHOOSE who and how they are here, it
 is a fresh start We hope that they make good choices!

They will need:

- √ To attend school each day
- ✓ Correct uniform
- √ School bag
- ✓ Yondr Pouch
- ✓ Pencil case with Pen, pencil, ruler, rubber, sharpener and colours.
- ✓ Any exercise books/work they have been given to take home.
- ✓ Reading book
- ✓ Popper wallet to store homework, notes etc...
- ✓ PE kit for the lesson leggings/tracksuit/shorts, t-shirt and trainers.
- ✓ Growth mindset

95% SOUNDS TOO HIGH?

- Over a school year...
- 95% attendance = 10 days off
- 90% attendance = 4 weeks off

----PERSISTENT ABSENTEEISM----

- 85% attendance = 6 weeks off
- 80% attendance = 8 weeks off
- 75% attendance = 10 weeks off

THE LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- Having attendance **less than 90**% classifies a student as a 'persistent absentee' and can result in legal consequences.
 - Fines of between £60-£120
 - Court appearance with fines up to £1,000
 - Court Orders
